David Lee Csicsko is a Chicago Artist and designer creating work that includes stained glass and mosaics for large scale private and public projects, including the chapel at the Ann & Robert H. Lurie Children's Hospital of Chicago, mosaics for the Belmont train station, and a mosaic fountain for the Margaret Donahue mosaic park in Chicago's Lakeview neighborhood. David has also produced our "Heroes for Heroes" images of different Scottish Heroes every month in support of the residents and staff of Caledonia Senior Living & Memory Care.



David illustrated the popular children's book *The Skin You Live In* by Michael Tyler, now in its 16th printing and recently translated into Spanish & French and in 2012, he decorated the 2012 Obama Christmas White House.

Along with his graphic portrait commissions, Mr. Csicsko's clever, stylized portraits of architects, composers and writers are sold as notecards in museum shops and concert halls nationwide.

For over thirty years Mr. Csicsko has volunteered his time creating artwork to support many Chicago charities.
